Five wishes upon a star.

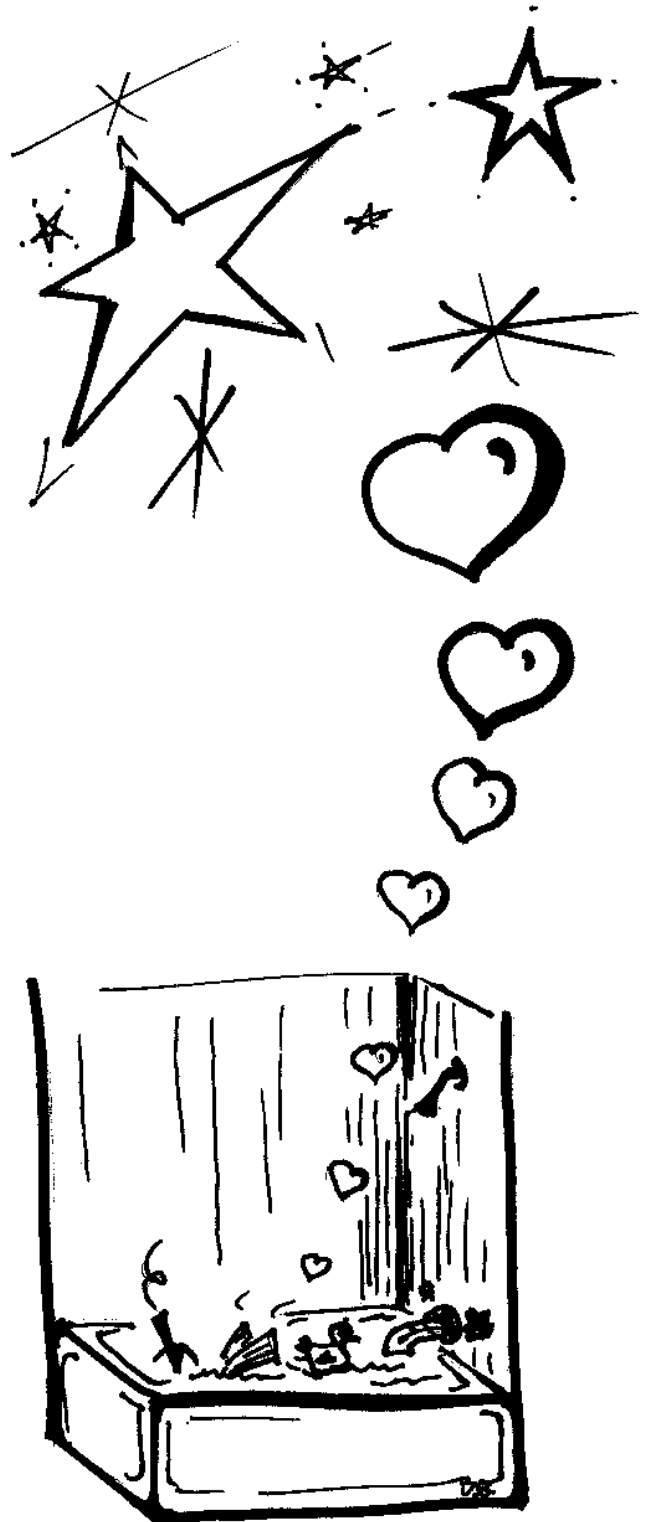
Six silly secrets.
